Children may experience abuse and neglect at any age and it may have a profound impact not only on their immediate safety and health but on their long-term development and wellbeing.

Safeguarding is the action that is taken to promote the welfare of children and protect them from harm. preventing harm to children's health or development. ensuring children grow up with the provision of safe and effective care. taking action to enable all children and young people to have the best outcomes.

Safeguarding in schools: best practice

Promote the safeguarding of children by providing for relationships and sex education in schools. These help to establish a set of principles which bring the focus back to the looked after child while acting in their best interests and taking into account their wishes and feelings. While most children will adapt and settle back into school, others will need more support. Make sure that staff are aware of and understand the issues that children in your school might be dealing with. Talk through potential scenarios and include examples that are specific to your school context.

Safeguarding and mental health: Reintegrating your pupils

Safeguarding refers to keeping a child safe both in a care setting, such as a school, and at home. Safeguarding is something which is taken extremely seriously in childcare settings, and for good reason too. The Crime Survey for England and Wales found that 1 in 5 adults experienced some form of child abuse before the age of 16.

Safeguarding is most successful when all aspects are integrated together. Three key elements include a clear safeguarding ethos, a policy that sets out clear expectations and processes, and high-quality training that ensures staff know what to do and do it consistently across the school. Other key aspects of safeguarding include: Ethos; Policy; Continuing Professional Development (CPD) Safer Recruitment; Safer Perimeter

The best interests of children must always come first. If anyone has a safeguarding concern they must act immediately. A designated safeguarding lead (DSL) or deputy should be available. Unsuitable people must not be allowed to have access to children.

Safeguarding Responsibilities in Schools: Duties Explained

Safeguarding includes all aspects of what it means to keep children and adults safe in school. For example, it ensures all adults in schools have undertaken a DBS (Disclosure and Barring Service) check , educating adults in school on spotting the signs of abuse, carrying out risk assessments for trips and ensuring there is an adequate number of first aiders on the school staff.
